Me ko = I go / Mee ko = I'm going /

Menko = I'm not going.

Wo ko he? = Where are you going?

Mee ko fie. = I'm going home.

Wei ye sen? = How much is This

Te so ma me wai = Reduce it for me,
please.

Me paakyew te so = Please, reduce it

Ne boo ye den. = The price is expensive.

Ne boo ye den dodo = The price is too
expensive
